

Safe Operations Guidelines for P&R Facility Rentals

Thank you for choosing to reserve a Columbia Parks and Recreation facility!
Per Order No. 2020-21, effective (noon) March 24, 2021 the Columbia/Boone County Public Health and Human Services Department has lifted restrictions on occupancy limits for large gatherings and entertainment venues.

General Public Health Guidelines

The following Guidelines below must be maintained to host events in Parks and Recreation Facilities.

- All event attendees should have no flu-like symptoms within the previous 72 hours including:
 - Temperature of 100.4 degrees or greater
 - Shortness of breath
 - Chills
 - Sore throat
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Unexplained muscle pain
 - Feeling of unexplained fatigue
- Large groups can be seated together but tables should be socially distanced 6 ft apart.
- Masks must be worn indoors unless actively eating or drinking.
 - All food and beverage must be consumed while seated.
- Bar service and buffet service are allowed under this order; provided that social distancing and face mask requirements are observed by all patrons. Any patron ordering at the bar, visiting the buffet or otherwise moving about the premises is required to wear a face mask at all times.
- As much as possible, Condiments should be distributed in single serve packets or containers.
- Masks must be worn at all times when attendees are not at their tables.
- Dancing is prohibited.
- It is recommended that one should not attend if considered high risk, or living in close quarters to someone having a high risk profile.
- Please collect the following information and save for at least 30 days after your reservation:
 - Name of Attendees/Team Roster
 - Contact Information
 - Time and Date of Attendance

Please Note - Contact tracing information will remain private with the event organizer and only be requested in the event of a positive case of COVID-19 and contact tracing is necessary to mitigate further transmission.
